- The top 10 plastic items found on beaches and oceans are single use plastics that can easily be avoided!

PLAN AHEAD!

Make a plastic-free kit for when you're on the go. Pack a reusable shopping bag, reusable coffee mug and water bottle, containers for leftovers and reusable straw/utensils.

THINK BEFORE YOU BUY!

- Choose to buy products with reduced packaging, or recyclable packaging.
- Look for products made from post-consumer recycled content.

BE CREATIVE!

- Try to find more plastic-free swaps like bamboo toothbrushes, or electric razors.
- Ditch the plastic wrap and sandwich baggies. Use beeswax wraps, or containers with lids.

Try to make the switch one item at a time. Use up what you have or give old items away. When its time to replace an item, look for plastic free options!
