### APRIL 2023 RECYCLING PROGRAM UPDATE

#### **NARRATIVE**

The Recycling Outreach Team attended the 9<sup>th</sup> Annual NYS Organics Summit this month. Some of the topics discussed at the conference included: *Updates and Regulatory Walkthrough from NYSDEC, Composting Outreach/Education, Compostable Products, Managing Odors at Compost Facilities, PFAS at Compost Facilities, Anaerobic Digestion, and Exploring Compost Use End Markets.* Angelina Brandt moderated a panel session about *Expanding Residential Food Scrap Compost Programs*. Tanesia White assisted with moderating a *Young Professionals Networking Event* at the conference. Staff attended a Tour and Equipment Demonstration at the Onondaga County Compost Facility.

The Agency launched bagged compost sales this month on April 1<sup>st</sup> which will continue in conjunction with the Electronics Recycling Program, which also opened on April 1<sup>st</sup>. Residents can now pre-order compost during the week through a new online store and pick up Saturdays.

Our Spring Compost Bin & Rain Barrel Sale is still active. The pre-order sale ends May 19<sup>th</sup>.

A new initiative we are rolling out this month is an Earth Day Tree and Shrub Distribution for residents. This program is made possible with the support of the Ulster County Soil and Water Conservation District. Free tree saplings will be distributed on Earth Day, Saturday April 22<sup>nd</sup>

The Agency will host a Household Hazardous Waste Collection Event on April 29<sup>th</sup> at the New Paltz Facility. This program is by appointment only and accommodates up to 300 participants.

The ROT will be submitting an application for the NYS Pollution Prevention Institute's Community Grants Program, a competitive grant awarded annually to projects that raise awareness and understanding of pollution prevention practices.

The ROT is actively engaged in multiple projects and program requests. The ROT has coordinated a significant advertising campaign over the next two months to promote our many events, classes, and services. The ROT is actively developing many new teaching tools.

<u>Background:</u> In 2022, the New Paltz Climate Action Coalition began an initiative to encourage local residents to bring their own reusable containers to area restaurants. Tiffins are multi-tiered metal food containers that replace wasteful, non recyclable to-go containers. New Paltz Climate Smart Taskforce & New Paltz Climate Action have launched a long-term Tiffin distribution campaign that has been very successful.

The Recycling Outreach Team will submit an application for an "Ulster County Tiffin Project" to expand on their program, partner with community groups, and launch a Tiffin distribution program in July 2024, to coincide with Plastic Free July. The campaign would educate about waste reduction as a pollution prevention strategy, and raise awareness about hidden toxins in food-contact packaging, such as PFAS.
