

90-95% of people reported the class had a high or significantly high impact in making them more aware and knowledgeable about the pollution prevention issues we shared, a 50% overall increase after taking the class.

Motivation to "use reusable containers while at home" often or always, increased from 87% to 97%.

Motivation to "use other reusables like bottles and bags" often or always, increased from 74% to 89%.

Motivation to "pick up litter that is not yours" increased from 35% to 71%



Along with other Directors, she assists with technology research to develop strategies for waste diversion, and make recommendations that align with a commitment to sustainable materials management. U.S. Composting Council


