Our Recycling Outreach Team is proud to present this annual report to our Board of Directors, elected officials, and other community stakeholders. The UCRRA Recycling Outreach Team proudly fosters environmental literacy about waste sustainability, so the Agency can help build resilient communities that can act on the environmental challenges of the future.

The programming featured in these pages would not have been possible without the continued support of the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation, the Environmental Protection Fund.

Another highly successful year, 2025 marked the third year of our bagged compost sales, an emphasis on festival waste and recycling, the growth of our volunteer program, a new Compost Book list, a revamp our our Reuse, Repair, & Resources Directory, the launch of a new Race to Zero Waste game, improved resources like our new 7Rs to Rethink Waste and other media. Staff participated in NYSAR3 Legislative Advocacy Day, the NYSAR3 Organics

Council, and other industry conferences and events that continuously deepen our expertise. We built new collaborations with Ulster County libraries through our innovative Compost Awareness Week campaign, hosted meet ups for the local municipal recycling workforce, and continued key programming like the Tree & Shrub Give-A-Way, Compost Bin & Rain Barrel Sale, Festival Bin Rentals, and other exciting projects.

The Recycling Outreach Team welcomes new team members Eva Barnett as Recycling Educator, and Ellie Reese as Administrative Assistant as well as 8 new Master Composter Recyclers; Denis C., Poppy C., Catherine B., Lee B. , Joel Z., Elisa Z., Adele B., and Jessica O. brining our total MCR cohort to twenty one (21) volunteers.







Ulster County Fair

Each year UCRRA hosts an outreach booth in "Climate Row" to educate Fair-goers about waste-sustainability. This week-long, "all hands on deck" event is an impactful way of reaching hundreds of citizens. 



UCRRA offers a FREE Festival Bin Rental Program to help events reduce waste and improve recycling and composting. Our zero-waste sorting stations make it easy for attendees to sort materials correctly and reduce contamination. Each station includes three clearly labeled bins—trash, recycling, and compost—complete with frames, color-coded lids, and simple, visual signage. Strategically placed and easy to use, these stations support cleaner events and better waste diversion.






Project Spotlight



Our radio advertising, PSAs, and underwriting program helped to spotlight seasonal programs, Agency's services, and key outreach messages.

Approximately 314 commercials aired on Radio Woodstock on a monthly schedule, March through December. Seventy eight (78) 30-second ads (+23 bonus) and one hundred eighty (180) 15-second ads (+33 bonus) commercials aired. 



Youtube Pre-Roll Campaign









86,840 sessions

Our website tracked 86,840 total sessions this year. Our Google Business Profile had 142,597 total views (10,000–15,000 per month), 60,063 searches (1,000–1,300 per month), and 5,534 website clicks (400–700 per month) from our Google Profile.

Our website features an AI powered Virtual Assistant (chatbot). In 2025 the Virtual Assistant had 2,173 conversations with customers, providing general agency information and recycling guidance 24/7.

Angelina Brandt, Director of Sustainability

Prior to joining the Agency in January 2019, Angelina was the Recycling and Composting Educator at Cornell Cooperative Extension, Schenectady County. Angelina holds a Bachelor of Technology from the Department of Agricultural Engineering at SUNY Cobleskill, where she studied Environmental Energy Technologies in Waste Management and Renewable Energy. In college, she was involved in a MSW gasification pilot project, spearheaded an award-winning college campus composting initiative, and completed internships with UCRRA, and with Community Compost Company. In her current role, she oversees the overall efficacy of waste sustainability programs at UCRRA, assists with technology research, supervises outreach staff and volunteers, and is sustainability liaison to elected officials, private industry, and other stakeholders. A life long local, Angie is happy to bring her passion to her hometown communities! She jokes that reduce-reuse-recycle is in her blood, having grown up in her parent's antique store in Saugerties as a kid! She still believes that one person's trash can be another person's treasure, and you'll often find her thrifting, yard sale-ing, upcycling, and stopping at the side of the road to rescue junked furniture or other cool vintage finds. There's something truly magical about recycling... her favorite trick is to transform food scraps into vermicompost!

Eva Barnett, Recycling Educator

After earning her BA in Film/Video from Evergreen State College in 2005, Eva moved to NYC to explore storytelling through dance and film. However, when she gained access to a small garden in Brooklyn, her focus shifted. In 2008, she moved to the Catskills to work on organic farms, deepening her connection to fresh, locally grown food. Her passion for sustainable food led her to work with renowned chefs, including Mary Cleaver, a leader in local sourcing and sustainability. In 2016, Eva opened her own café, Adella Dori, in Callicoon, NY, offering a menu based on what was available at the farmer's market. As the café grew in popularity, so did the waste it produced, prompting Eva to become a passionate advocate for recycling, composting, and sustainable waste management within her community. After selling the café in 2019, Eva furthered her knowledge by becoming a certified soil health analyst through Dr. Elaine Ingham's Soil Food Web School, where she studied the biology of healthy soils. In 2024, she joined the UCRRA's Master Composter/Master Recycling Certification course as a volunteer, and officially joined the UCRRA Recycling Outreach Team as Recycling Educator in March 2025. Eva loves connecting the dots between what we eat, what we waste, and how we can do better and is excited to help her community look at trash and see a valuable treasure trove of resources.
